# Trevor's story

My name is Trevor, I'm 68 years old and I've been at NOAH for three years. In my previous life I worked for a large PVC piping company as a project manager and travelled extensively through Africa. I was living a great life: I had a chalet in the Magaliesberg, owned a Harley Davidson and was an enthusiastic Hell's Angel. All that changed when my boss was assassinated, the company

closed down and over 22.000



people lost their job. I was unable to access my pension to which I had contributed for over 18 years and in spite of spending substantial amounts in legal fees, I was forced to sell all of my possessions, including my home.

I decided to make my way to Cape Town where I attempted to find a job. Very quickly my savings dwindled and I was homeless. I made my way to a shelter and became a relief driver for them. Yet I struggled to fit in to the night shelter environment and was heartbroken at all that I had lost.

A staff member at the shelter suggested I contact NOAH which I did and was lucky to find a place soon after. I recently starting driving the NOAH tuk-tuk – dropping off bread collections, doing shopping and collecting medication at the Day hospital. I feel like a young man again!

At NOAH, I also met my wife Nadia. My life has changed for the better, I am grateful to have somewhere lovely to live and something to do every day!

# **November Appeal**


